As our season of Lent draws near to an end, we will soon celebrate the Resurrected King. This day is a joyful one, but it is also one when the work of God is dramatically passed from Christ to us. It is in the power of Resurrection that we have been equipped to be Christ's presence ever since.

As I mentioned in last Sunday's sermon, I had an eye-opening experience at the (RE)Mission conference in Richmond, VA. I believe in my calling to pastor a church into future decades, but finding clarity of a path forward has always been the rub. Do we need to change? Adapt? Transform? Sure! But how? Well, it's a process, a long one.

The process begins with identity. If we don't know who we are, then we cannot know how to change or how to reach others. Part of that identity is accepting the reality of the Church's influence in the world. For example, Canada now exists in a cultural time that religious experts label "Post-Christian." The vast majority are not hostile towards Christianity. No, pastor Jon Hand says their feelings toward Christianity can be summed up with "Meh."

Ouch. Christianity has become so irrelevant in Canada that the mere mention of it only provokes a shoulder shrug. Christianity in America is rapidly heading this way, too, and it's not because good Christian people aren't trying or sincere; it's because the Church isn't changing, adapting to the new realities of the world.

Pastor Jon Hand has seen growth in his Canadian church by changing three core practices in his church: position, power, and posture. Instead of pursuing a worldly definition of these three practices, Hand's church has allowed Jesus to shape them. The transformation has been divine.

As we move forward, together, consider how you utilize your position, power, and posture in your everyday life. Are you above people or with them? Are you in control of people or are you empowering them? Are you telling them or are you listening to them? May the person of Jesus, our King, transform us that we would be more like him. \sim Alex
