Stained Glass Saints

This week we remember Rebecca and Cecil Hayes. The following is excerpted from "In the Beginning" - the 75th Anniversary history of First Baptist Church:

Cecil Hayes was once referred to - by a small boy in the church - as "that white-haired preacher." He is not a preacher, but he does appear to enjoy his religion as much as any minister. Cecil came to Corbin in 1919, just out of army service in World War I. He soon started attending the old First Baptist Church on Ford Street. He met Rebecca Booker, who, in his words, "suited my fancy," and they married on February 21, 1922. Shortly afterward, they joined the church.

In her tenure at First Baptist, Mrs. Hayes was a member of the choir, church pianist, associate organist, Sunday School department director, president of the Grace Class, and a member of the WMU. In 1967, she and Cecil went on a mission trip to Key West, FL.

Mr. Hayes served as a deacon at First Baptist, with 25 years as chair. For more than 50 years, he was director of a Sunday School department; an additional 12 years were spent as Sunday School Director Cecil's most visible - and longest - contribution to the church was as a member of the Sanctuary Choir, where he sang in the Bass section for 70 years (Someone once said that Cecil had a voice like God's, only deeper!). Born in the 19th century, Cecil Hayes lived through the entire 20th century, passing in January of 2000 at the age of 104.

We give thanks to God for the legacy of Rebecca and Cecil Hayes, two of our Stained Glass Saints.


