It is hard to see life as Robby saw it. It is hard to live life as this grandfather and his granddaughters are living it. It is difficult to remove distractions and simply exist for only a moment, let alone any significant amount of time. It is challenging to force yourself to look at life differently or from a different perspective.

I needed a change of window décor to see the courtyard anew. What simple change can you make in your life to see the world around you anew? How can you change your perspective, if only for a moment, to see the beauty of life around you? God is all around us. The evidence of God's handiwork exists everywhere you turn. Slow down for a moment. Alter your perspective and look for God. You just may find peace.






