


Stained Glass Saints Today we remember Ed Wyatt & Edith Wyatt

I read recently (I don't recall when or where--probably Facebook) that the opposite of laziness is not busyness. It was a good challenge for me to consider how I spend my time. We often think of lazy people as those who waste time doing nothing. However, there are many times in Scripture when Jesus was doing nothing, at least according to the perspective of the casual observer.

During a storm, he slept soundly, resting for the next part of his journey. In Gethsemane, he wandered off three different times to pray. The entire chapter of John 17 is Jesus praying. All these are inactive, unbusy times in Jesus' life, but none of these were lazy. The goal of the Christian life is not to be busy; it is to use our time wisely and for the Kingdom.

"The opposite of laziness is not busyness." This struck me because on any given day in the past few weeks here at the church, there have been a number of projects taking place. We are finishing the exterior painting on our sanctuary. The plaster work in the sanctuary is being repaired. A new playground has been installed between our buildings. We have sold the two buildings across from us on Roy Kidd Ave. The White Flag season has begun. Volunteers from all over have been in and out of our FLC to help Scarlette's Christmas shoebox ministry. Some of our stained glass windows have been reinstalled. New HVAC units have been installed in both stairwells in our educational building. Christmas decorations are popping up all over the building.

"The opposite of laziness is not busyness." No one can accuse us of being lazy, but are simply being busy for the sake of busyness? No, that's not the way I see it. We are busy trying to fulfill God's mission as it has been handed down to us here at First Baptist Church, Corbin, KY.

Some might see busyness, but I see the vibrant life of a congregation taking steps forward in its faithful response to the calling Christ has put on this church. Some might see painting and labor; I see hospitality. Some might see church people socializing and fellowshipping; I see the hands and feet of Christ. Some might see profitability; I see the wise and faithful use of the resources God has blessed us with.

The opposite of laziness is purposeful living. Our church is trying to live with purpose, on purpose. For all that God is doing and is trying to do through, I am grateful. As we journey further into the holiday season, let us not seek busyness, but faithfulness. God is at work among us. Let's continue the good work.
