

This Week We Remember Bobby Goins

Bobby was truly the face of the word "servant." He lived his life in service to others; in his daily life, his church, the Lions Club of Corbin, and especially in the education of the children of Corbin Independent Schools.

I think my introduction to Bobby was when I was about 8 years old. He and my sister, Carrie, woke the family up to inform us that Carrie had slipped out of the dorm at Union College and they had run off to get married and start their life together.

Bob was a butcher at the A&P at that time but soon came to work in our family business, Tri-County Motors, Inc., a Buick and Pontiac dealer as parts manager. He also worked part time as a projectionist at the Hippodrome and Corbin Drive-In Theaters. During this time, the 1950-60's, he was also a member of the Corbin Volunteer Fire Department. Later, he and Carrie owned Goins Market on Master Street and he helped me at G&S Auto Parts. Later, he went to work at Whayne Supply in Corbin, from where he retired. He also refereed numerous basketball games for many years all over southeastern Kentucky (by himself- not a trio) and I would ride along with him so he wouldn't be driving home alone. Bob loved high school sports, especially basketball and never missed the state tournament. He also loved the Kentucky Wildcats and went to many games thru the years.

He was an active member of First Baptist as a Deacon, Sunday School Teacher, and member of the Sanctuary Choir for many years. He was always ready to help any way he could. He also helped with the Lions Club Christmas Basket food drive for many, many years (Kim's son, Robbie, started helping him when he was 11 and this year was the first he missed because he was in Lexington). He served on the Corbin Independent School Board for almost 26 years and many of those as Chair.

He singlehandedly led the push for Tattersall Trails Estates to be taken into the Corbin Independent System and it is still talked about in Frankfort how one man made this happen.

Bob's greatest gifts were his wife, Carrie, and children, Scott (Atlanta, GA), Kathy (Corbin), and John (Corbin). Bob loved them dearly as well as his extended family and we all loved him!


