

Breaking News: COVID-19 vaccinations now available to people in 1B at four Baptist Health hospitals

Baptist Health Lexington, Louisville, Corbin, and Madisonville are currently accepting appointments and providing vaccines to anyone in priority groups 1A and 1B, hospital spokeswoman Ruth Ann Childers said over the weekend. Group 1A includes health care personnel and long-term care staff and residents. 1B includes people age 70 and older, K-12 personnel and first responders. Vaccines are becoming available for this second-tier priority group largely on a county-by-county basis. Appointments can be made at scheduleyourvaccine.com.

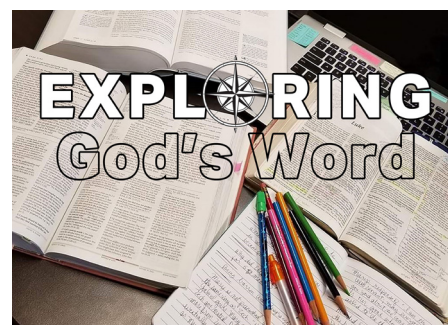

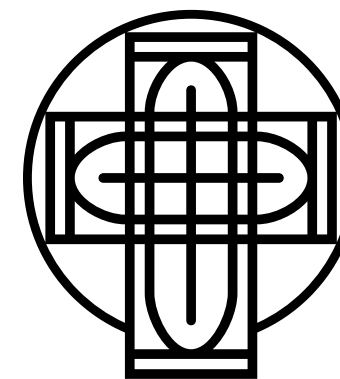

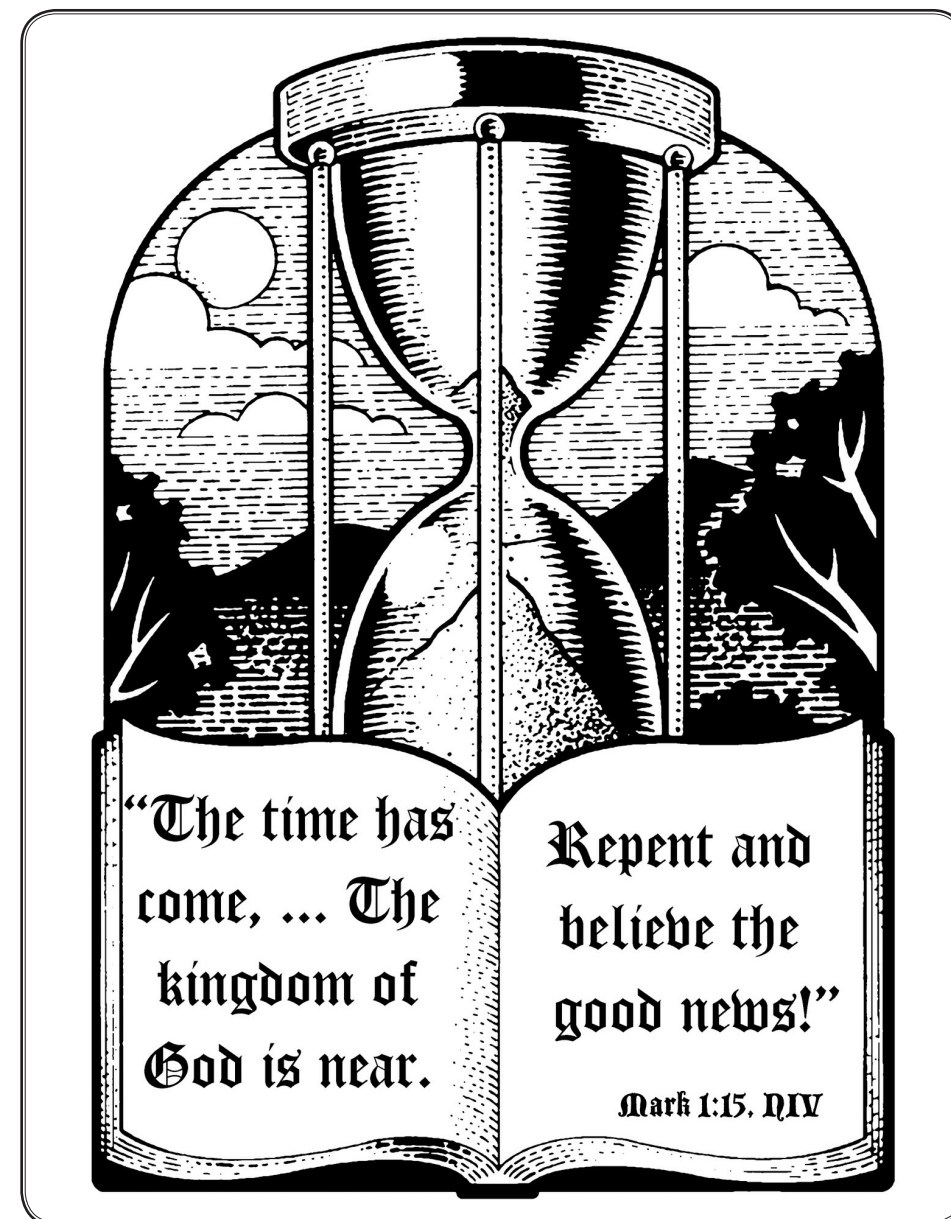
