



**This Week We Remember
Alpha Mae Stansberry**

Alpha Mae Stansberry started attending First Baptist Church around 1936. She was a faithful member until her death in 2002. She became the first female principal in the Laurel County School System. She taught Senior English at Corbin High School before she took the principalship job. Her love of education and drive in her career was instilled in everyone she taught. She used her gift of teaching in the church, teaching adult women. She was also the President of the WMU, as well as the Ossoli Club in Corbin. She was also active in Eastern Star.

Alpha was widowed twice before she passed on. She came from New Mexico with her 5-year old daughter, Jacky, and her husband in a casket, on a train, back to Corbin, to her parents. She returned to Corbin and married Russell Stansberry in 1937, having three children: Rose Ann, Vickie, and John, who were all raised in First Baptist Church. Jacky, Rose Ann, and Vickie moved out of the area after they married. John stayed in Corbin and raised his family in FBC, sitting alongside Alpha Mae every Sunday.

Alpha Mae was one of the most progressive, independent women of her time. She paved the way for many young women, teaching them in her career and in church to recognize their value and worth. She encouraged all women to take care of their husbands, families, and careers. She was a woman of balance. She instilled this same drive in her children and grandchildren. She effectively balanced her career and her family, all the while living out her faith. She was the epitome of grace and class. And she never missed a Kentucky basketball game.

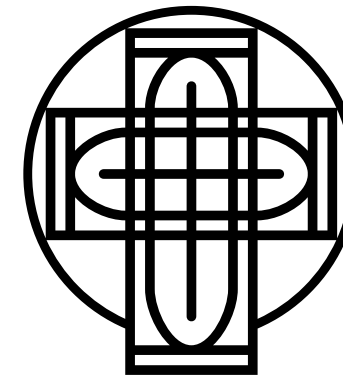

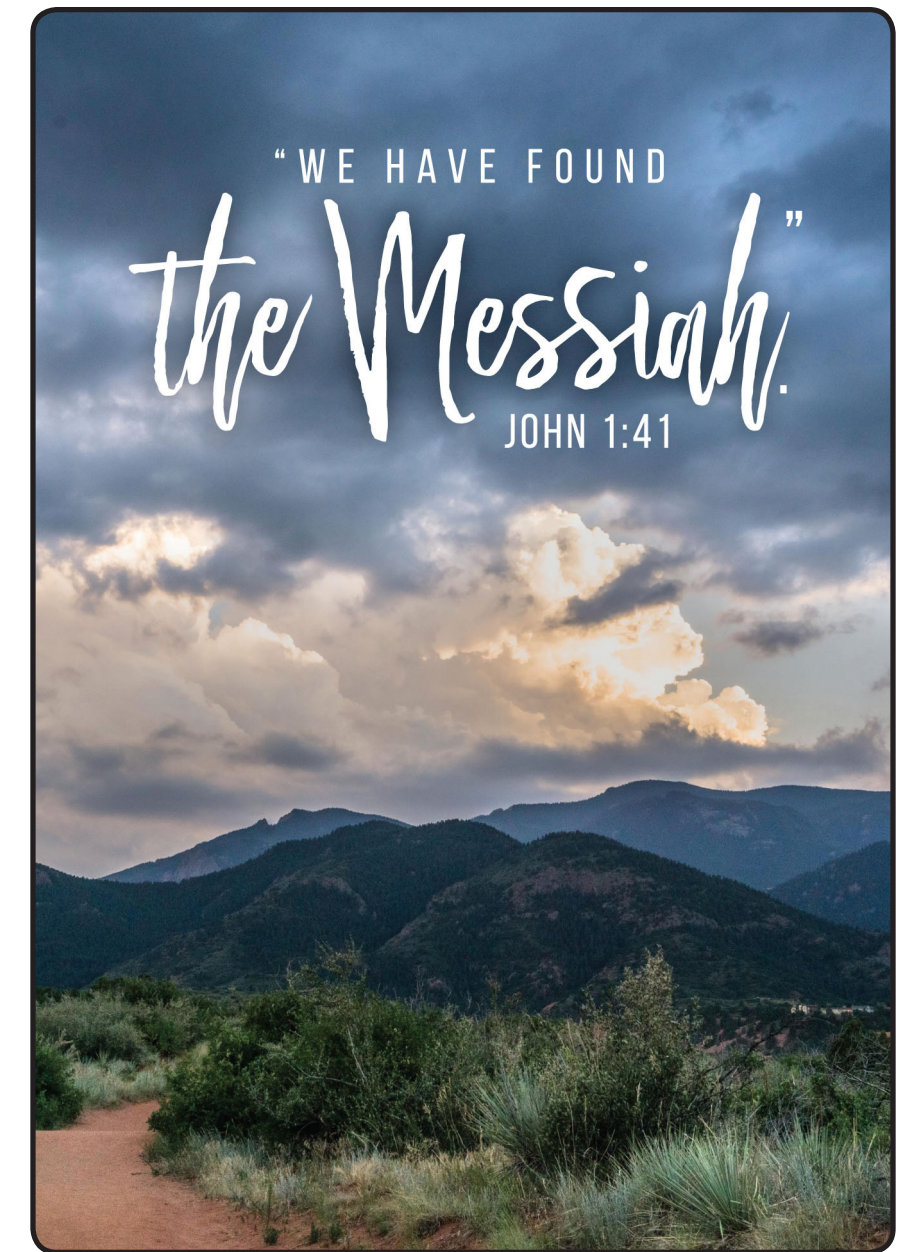
