Also, let's focus on learning what God's word says in whatever ways are best for each of us individually. In the last few years, I have enjoyed the free Bible app on my phone. I love that it can read to me in my car! The short term reading plans are terrific and inspiring with topics ranging from teens, parenting, grief, stress, money management, and even the NFL. And whatever passage you choose to read can be changed to just about any translation.

TV is usually an unlikely source for Bible study, but The Chosen is an exception. It's a series about the ministry of Jesus and the disciples, based fairly accurately on scripture, but with modern language and some writers' liberties with filling in the gaps. If you are looking for clean, inspiring entertainment with a message of hope, I hope you'll try it. You have to download the free app in order to watch on your phone, tablet or tv.

Isaiah 55: 10-13 tells us that even as rain and snow come from heaven and cause growth, so does God's word. So let's grow together in God's word! ~Donna Davis

We have seen a recent and rapid uptick in COVID-19 amid the omicron variant. The Whitley County incidence rate is 101.6, which qualifies as a high level of transmission by every metric. As with all pandemic changes, we are given an opportunity to reevaluate what it means for us to be a community partner in Corbin.

In looking to establish a metric based response to the ever-fluid pandemic, the Church Council has agreed to a new proposal for our congregational gatherings. When the Whitley County incidence rate hits 50.0 or higher, we recommend social distancing in the sanctuary and wearing masks when gathered, especially while singing.

Previously, we had adhered to Kentucky's "in the red" incidence rate of 25.0 or higher. We believe that is too stringent, so we have chosen 50.0, which is designated as a "substantial rate of transmission" by the CDC. The two safety recommendations of social distancing and masking were chosen because medical experts still deem these as the most effective ways to protect each other.

I believe it is important to inform you that the Church Council did not come to this proposal unanimously. As is true with any community, there was a diverse set of opinions for how to best proceed. There is disagreement, and I believe that makes us stronger. Acting in the spirit of Christian kindness, we can disagree, agreeably, and, in noticing that there is a wide range of thought, I pray this helps each of us find grace in the midst of decision-making.

The goal of the faith community is not uniformity, but like-mindedness. We strive to be like-minded in our grace and respect for each other and also our concern for our neighbors. While we might disagree on the methods, the spirit of kindness remains. This makes me proud.

As with all Church Council recommendations, this is not a mandate. You are invited to respond to these recommendations with full autonomy. We are grateful for our church, and we hope these conversations and decisions help to provide the safest faith opportunities we can. Stay warm and be healthy. - Alex
