

This Week We Remember Grandma White

"In the beginning, First Baptist was a mission of the Williamsburg church which gave it financial support." Baptist beget Baptists, that was the only way Baptist churches popped up 100+ years ago. In order to begin anywhere, though, there must be someone on the ground doing the work. "Grandma White moved to Corbin in 1894, just prior to the town's incorporation."

Grandma White is the heart behind our church's founding. Sure, there were thirteen other charter members and a benevolent mother church to our south, but everything that matters begins with one heart, one person who will see it through. Ours was Grandma White, "a staunch Baptist in belief and tradition... (who) was not satisfied until First Baptist Church, Corbin, was born."

R.C. Kimble, a former pastor from the early 20th century, wrote in 1915 that Grandma White joined together with "13 other Baptists who were willing to covenant as one body in Christ, for the maintenance of public worship, the ordinances, and the preaching of the gospel at home and abroad."

As a footnote in Kimble's writing, he said, "Let one name be honored -- 'Grandma White' = a crown." As we honor our many Stained Glass Saints, we would be remiss if we did not celebrate our first saint, Grandma White. Without her tenacious spirit and a deeply held Baptist commitment, we may not exist today as we do.

As we march on toward the 100 year celebration of worshiping in our sanctuary, may we do so celebrating all who have made this church what it is today. May we look back with gratitude upon those who were faithful, for in their faithfulness, we have found a spiritual home here at First Baptist Church, Corbin and a family of faith with which "to covenant as one body in Christ."



April will be here before you know it!


