Instead of focusing on this, though, I choose to focus on the many people who give of their time and talents to ensure church gatherings and her mission could continue.

A big thank you to Troy Mock, Jeff Tipton, J. Bill Sosh, Darrell Tremaine, Todd Tremaine, and Bryce Barton for helping mop up all the water that overflowed downstairs on Christmas Eve. A big thank you to Troy Mock, Paul Sims, and Carolyn Garr for reimagining worship in such a way that we could still gather meaningfully for worship in the fellowship hall. We are blessed at this church to have so many who care so deeply about this church. As for how we move forward, the Facilities Management Committee and the Finance Committee have agreed to hire Leo Jones & Son, Inc. to put in a new HVAC system for the sanctuary.
