

Today We Remember Cathy Hall

Cathy came to First Baptist Church as a family unit, along with husband, Chuck and daughter, Cierra. Cathy grew up with a Holiness background, yet found a connection at FBC.

Being a mother to Cierra was Cathy's greatest joy. She read all the baby books and followed them to the letter, determinded to provide a stable, structured routine for Cierra. She was proud of her work in journalism for the radio and often cautioned us to remember that every story has at least two sides.

Cathy could always be counted on to support the ministries of the church, even when the idea wasn't hers, or when it wasn't glamorous. In the summer you could find her sorting through endless piles of clothes for the rummage sale in the hot gym, or building and decorating sets for Vacation Bible School. She was the first to volunteer to chaperone or otherwise assist with children's activities, even when it was a little out of her comfort zone. She believed in leading by example and of being prsent with her daughter in ministry. Nicole Farrar, Minister for Students, recalls, "If I was in a pinch, I knew I could call on her and she would be there. And I knew that her word was gold. If she said she'd do something, she followed through."

When Cathy was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, she leaned on her church for support. "I remember her coming to the church the day of her diagnosis." says Nicole. "I was the only minister there, so she came into my office, sat down, and told me what she had just found out. And we both cried a bit, and prayed together. I was so thankful that she gave me the gift, that day, of trusting me with her news, of shaing her heart and her fears and uncertainties."

Cathy was a faithful member of Sandi Curd's Sunday School class. Sandi recalls, "I remember the evening Cathy Hall called me about her diagnosis. She called me in the role of Sunday School teacher, not as a friend or confidant. She wanted to provide her husband, Church, with a spiritual support system and was enlisting our class. Cathy was not worried about herself. She had such confidence in knowing her salvation promise would be fulfilled. She worried for Chuck, hoping he would lean into God's comfort." Cathy allowed her church to minister to her. The Ladies of Lydia's Cloth went to Cathy's house, anointed her head with oil, and prayed, after reading scripture about healing.

When Cathy was sick in the hospital while Cierra was preparing for baptism, someone had the idea of holding the baptism in the hospital so Cathy could attend her daughter's baptism. We immediately began to think about how we could do it and decided it was possible. However,

Cathy decided it was more important to her for Cierra to have the memory of her baptism in the church even if Cathy could not be present.

Cathy's most incrediable legacy was leading by example and preparing Chuck and Cierra for a life without her. Nicole states, "In my own life now, as a mother of two young children, I do still think of Cathy and of how she really lived her life- demonstrating her values, giving back, trying to honor God and what she felt God required of her, being fully present, long before she knew her time would be unbearable short. Lead by example. Live the faith you want your children to know as well."
