

To explain how these two ladies worked together, you need to know their relationship: Maxine was an aunt to Joyce and a sister to Joyce's mother.

Joyce was a daughter of Curt and Rushie Lawson, and had been a lifetime member of First Baptist Church. Her husband, Alan Dizney, was also a lifelong member. When Maxine and her first husband, C.S. Rapier, moved back to Corbin after retirement, they followed Maxine's family members to First Baptist.

To become an active member of the community and a worker in the church, Maxine depended on Joyce. The drawback: Joyce didn't drive! So, it became known that the two came as a team if either was called to a particular chore or position. Maxine drove, Joyce rode, and Joyce volunteered for the both of them.

Their favorite volunteer jobs dealt with the children of the church, exspecially VBS. They worked on their plans weeks in advance, but sometimes their plan went awry. Maxine had a big heart when it came to children and the elderly. Christmas was a special time for Joyce and Maxine to team up and buy needed items for children and older adults. Maxine, who was constantly looking for ways to help others, would often remark to all at the table in a restaurant, "Our server needs a 'good' tip; he is a college student and needs the money."
