Congregational Network for Healthcare

First Baptist Church has been chosen by Baptist Health Corbin to participate in the pilot program for the Congregational Network for Healthcare. What this means for our church members is possible help with care after leaving the hospital. We hope to have volunteers available to provide transportation to medical appointments, the pharmacy, or grocery store. Perhaps there will be a need for someone to be present during a Home Health visit or other flexible needs.

Our local hospital, Baptist Health Corbin, is launching this program to improve the health of our community. When a church member who is signed up for the program is admitted to the hospital, the church office will be notified and that will ensure a visit (only if desired) and an offering of follow-up care if needed.

What we need to get the program started is a **group of volunteers** to take responsibility to help one morning or afternoon a week. Help will not be required every week, but it would probably be best to choose a certain day to help. This will give our members a way to get help for the services they need.

In addition, the hospital will offer health screening, educational opportunities (like CPR classes, etc.) free of charge. They will also provide assistance with end of life guidance and advanced directives.

In order to have a great working program, we need first a group of volunteers. This will not have to take a great deal of time, but it will require dedication.

Most important for the Congregational Network to function, we need to have our members to sign up. Simple forms will be available in the office (these cannot be photocopied because of computer scanning). Then if a member is admitted to the hospital, the network which includes our church will be notified.

Hopefully Melissa Smitley, the Navigator(Director) of the program will make a presentation at First Baptist to help explain the program. This is not just for people who think they might need to go to the hospital. Our church will receive the benefits of being a part of the network, and this will increase the level of pastoral care.


