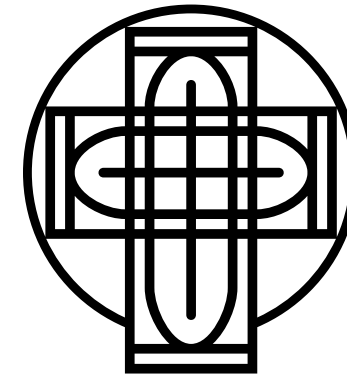

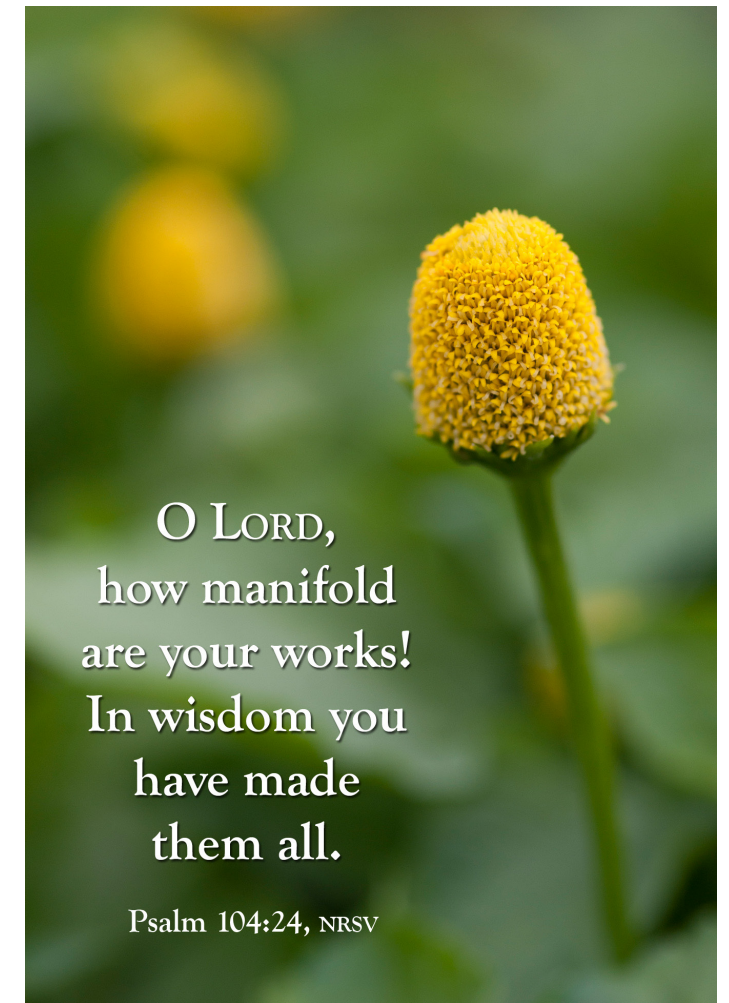

I am reading a book with other clergy currently, and we plan to meet virtually to discuss it soon. I believe all versions of book clubs are formative and beneficial. I say that to encourage you to read and to discuss. I also say it because a particular line in it struck me in a fascinating way.

A man is reflecting on whether or not a particular year he lived was his greatest year to date. He thinks declaring any one year as the best is silly, but this one year stuck out more than others. The reason it stuck out was, in the author's words, "that particular year held the sweetness of a time that contained no thoughts of a beginning and no thoughts of an end."

Pentecost is Sunday. It is absolutely one of my favorite days on the Christian calendar. Don't get me wrong, Christmas and Easter reign supreme, but Pentecost is the birth of Christ's church, the outpouring of God's Spirit, and the understanding of the Good News for the entire world! It's a significant day!

The very essence of this day, the Holy Spirit, has also confounded Christ-followers for centuries. The Spirit is intangible, uncontainable, and incomprehensible. We have no control over the Spirit, yet, somehow, we are supposed to allow it complete control over us.

As you consider what this means in your life, I invite you again to the line that struck me, " that particular year held the sweetness of a time that contained no thoughts of a beginning and no thoughts of an end." I believe we find the Spirit in the places where we relinquish control, the moments when we care not about the beginning or the end. The Spirit is now, always present in what is happening right now. Find yourself in the now and see what the Spirit will do!
