We are also reaching out to Sunday school teachers and leaders and to Wednesday night cooking teams to see how feasible it is resume classes and Bible study. If you fall into either or both of those groups, please let us know if you are willing to continue in those roles.

We have made great progress through this pandemic, and we are inching ever closer to the finish line. With the numbers continuing to decline and the vaccinations increasing, we hope to continue expanding our in-person participation. There are many logistical kinks to work out as we learn how to safely open activities at the church. We are grateful for your prayers, support, and continued patience as we move forward.


