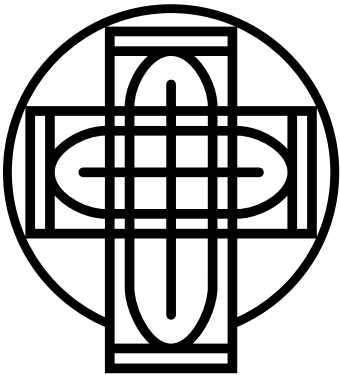

Thy Kingdom Come: Shalom

My vision emerges from the context of a larger community vision for wholeness and a Healthy Community. In our broader community we have a need for a myriad of services and opportunities for employment, home-caregiver support, drug treatment and personal rehabilitation, support for grandparents raising grandchildren, etc. From a community health perspective, current barriers and opportunities include a lack of access to preventive care and chronic disease management, compounded by social disparities and social determinants of health. Chief of these are affordable access to care, transportation issues, food insecurity and housing insecurity.

Only through the working together of community resources like government agencies, not-for-profit groups and faith groups, will we be able to create a supportive and sustainable community.

First Baptist Church can not, and should not, address these issues in isolation. However, as an expression of the kingdom of God, it can demonstrate the moral mandate for creating the Peaceable Kingdom and model collaboration, generosity and commitment to all of God’s creation.

As a congregation, we will focus both inwardly and outwardly. Inwardly, we will insure the spiritual growth of our members through discipleship, education, worship, prayer, attention to stewardship of our bodies, pastoral care, and Bible study, creating a healthy congregation (mind, body, spirit). We will equip ourselves for service in the name of Christ and we will help members discover their gifts for ministry. Outwardly, we will reach and care for others through evangelism, individual and community service, education, and a message of acceptance and grace.

Which ministries we become engaged in will be an expression of what we have discovered about our gifts and resources through our inward journey (“how has God equipped us?”) and an exploration of the needs and opportunities for service as we engage the community outwardly (“where is God already at work and what are the needs that call forth our gifts and resources?”).

Our modeling of such a holistic approach will be reflected in our care of nature (gardening, landscaping, waste stream issues, etc.), our use of our physical plant, partnerships in the community, attention to creating sustainability of programs and services, and generosity without judgment.
