

FBC Logo Stained Glass Suncatcher



Today We Remember Ora "Orie" Siler

He showed up on the first day of the Nibroc Rummage Sale- this was back in the mideighties when the sale ran for a full week- and was there to "help" for the remainder of the

sale. The next Sunday he made his way to church, where he became an always-present participant in the Don Robinson class and in our worship service.

Born in Harlan County, Ora "Orie" Siler, while a toddler, suffered brain damage as the result of Scarlet fever. In spite of this challenge, Orie had worked in the coal mines of Eastern Kentucky, had been a veterinarian's assistant in Cincinnati, and had traveled to 48 states and 3 Canandian provinces with the circus (which he called "Ring, Bing and Bang'Em") before making his home in Corbin.

When we first encountered Orie, he was living in a boarding house just a few yards from church, where he had one room, a shared bath, and no kitchen privileges. It was a red-letter day when we were able to move him into Baptist Housing- his home for the next 15 years.

At one point, Orie, a severe diabetic who didn't follow doctor's orders, held the record at Baptist Health Corbin as the most-hospitalized person in the hospital's history. When in hospital, he liked to roam the hallways in his open-back hospital gown. When not in hospital, he would often be found in the church kitchen- no lights onraiding the cookie stash, and was always looking for ways to sneak a little sugar into his diet.

Orie could always be counted on to provide a laughwhether intended or not- through some action or comment (sometimes in the midst of a worship service). He was fiercely loyal to "his" kids (the youth group) and he was a beloved fixture at First Baptist Church until the end of his life.
