
# The Church Council has decided it is safe to reopen in-person worship for 30 people as long as our guidelines are followed carefully. The Church Council has also implemented a thorough plan to navigate our decision-making during this pandemic. If you would like to worship in-person, we ask that you only sign up once per month. If you want to come more than once a month, you can be placed on a reserve list by contacting Pamela or Dorotha. On Sundays when our allotment of seats is not filled, we will contact those on the reserve list to fill the open spots. To reserve seats for worship, please visit www.corbinfbc.org/registration or call the church office by Friday at 12:00. Below is the in-person worship plan and guidelines.

# **COVID In-person Worship Plan:**

- ·We will reopen to 30 people while Whitley County is in the red. This includes all of our previous guidelines with individual dismissal.
- ·While in the orange, we will remain open only to 30, but we will remove the dismissal caveat.
- ·While in the yellow, we will open to 50 with the same protocols as orange.
- ·If in green, we will open to 72 (which is the most we can safely have in our sanctuary) with all the same orange/yellow protocols.
- ·We will not have in-person worship on Christmas Eve unless we are in the yellow or green.
- ·If we do not host in-person worship for Christmas Eve, we propose a two hour window to enter the sanctuary and receive Communion. There will be a recorded worship service, too.

# COVID In-person worship guidelines:

- ·If you are experiencing any of the associated symptoms (temperature, persistent cough, etc.) please do not attend worship.
- ·Please arrive no later than 10:15 on Sunday morning. Enter through the wheelchair accessible ramp entrance across from the Post Office.
- ·Wear a mask upon entering the building.
- ·Based on the number in your party, look for the number of "Available Seat" signs that are proportional to your party size, and please sit there. Your worship bulletin(s) will be there.
- ·Unfortunately, there cannot be any singing from the congregation.
  Outside of singing, you can participate in worship as you usually would.
- ·We do invite you to participate in all responsive readings and prayers.
- ·Always maintain a social distance of six feet or more from others outside of your party.
