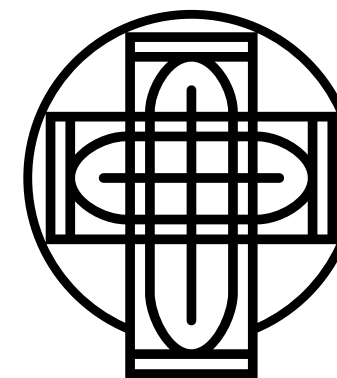

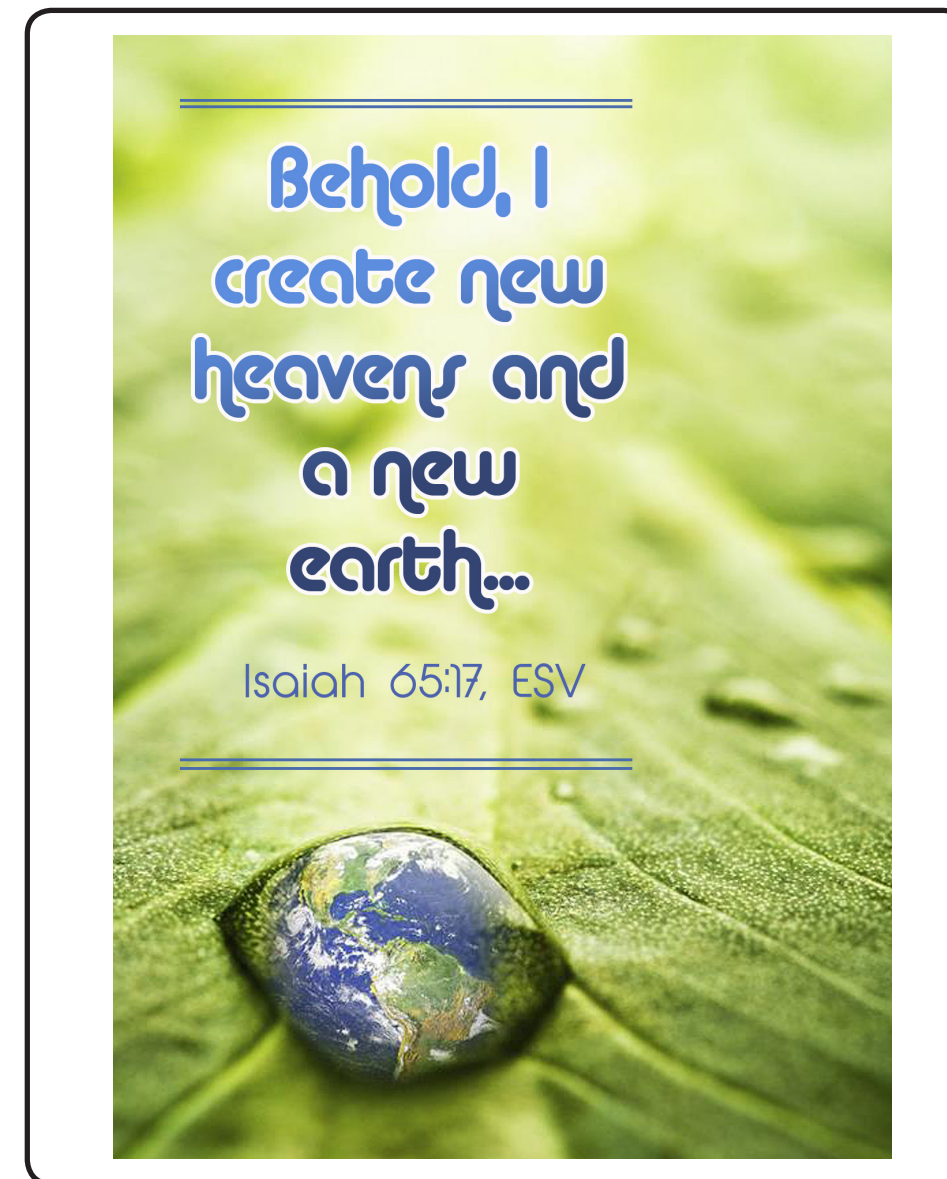

FBC Youth- All Saints Day/Dia de los Muertos

This past Sunday FBC Student ministries celebrated All Saints Day by practicing and learning about Dia de los Muertos (or “Day of the Dead”)!

Dia de los Muertos is a two-day holiday originating from Aztec and Spanish culture, which is practiced to help reunite the living and dead. Families create ofrendas (Offerings) on personal or public altars to honor and remember their departed family members that have passed. These altars are decorated with bright yellow and orange marigold flowers, photos of the departed, and the favorite foods and drinks of the ones being honored. The offerings are believed to encourage visits from the land of the dead as the departed souls hear their prayers, smell their foods, and join in the celebrations! As followers of Jesus, we discussed these two holidays (All Saints Day & Dia de los Muertos) and their traditional practices- thinking about the similarities and the differences we found between them. We then made our own “ofrendas” for those that we have lost- to help us share about, grieve, remember, and ultimately celebrate and thank God for the gift of life as well as the gift of friends, families, and saints who have come before us.

Last, but not least, we took some time to just have a good bit of fun by watching the hit Pixar movie “Coco”, which tells the story of a young boy who longs to become a musician! Through the traditional celebration of the Day of the Dead, the movie Coco tells a beautiful (visually and musically!) story about the gift of life, the power of family, and what it can mean for us to support each other as pilgrims on this journey.
