Curt was a prankster in a quiet way. Once Sunday when Paul Sims had only been here for a short period of time, Curt didn't particularly like the hymn chosen so he held his hymnal up far enough for Paul to observe him tearing out that page from the book! Only to find later that the page torn was the order of service! He would also put his arm up in the air showing his watch for the hint to finish his sermon to John Dunaway.

Curt, after retiring, would take the grocery list that Mary Griffith would give him for the Wednesday night meal, buy the food and bring it back for the cooks to prepare. He was a person that wanted to help others in all ways possible!

Curt Lawson was a true Christian who wanted to lead a life that God has set for all to adhere to in their everyday life. He truly was a legacy for all to follow in his love of his church.

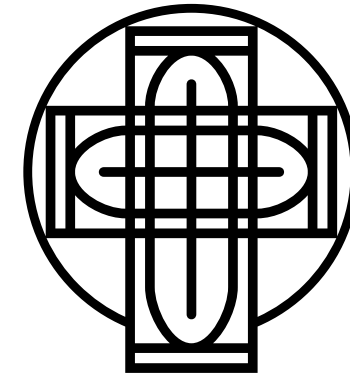

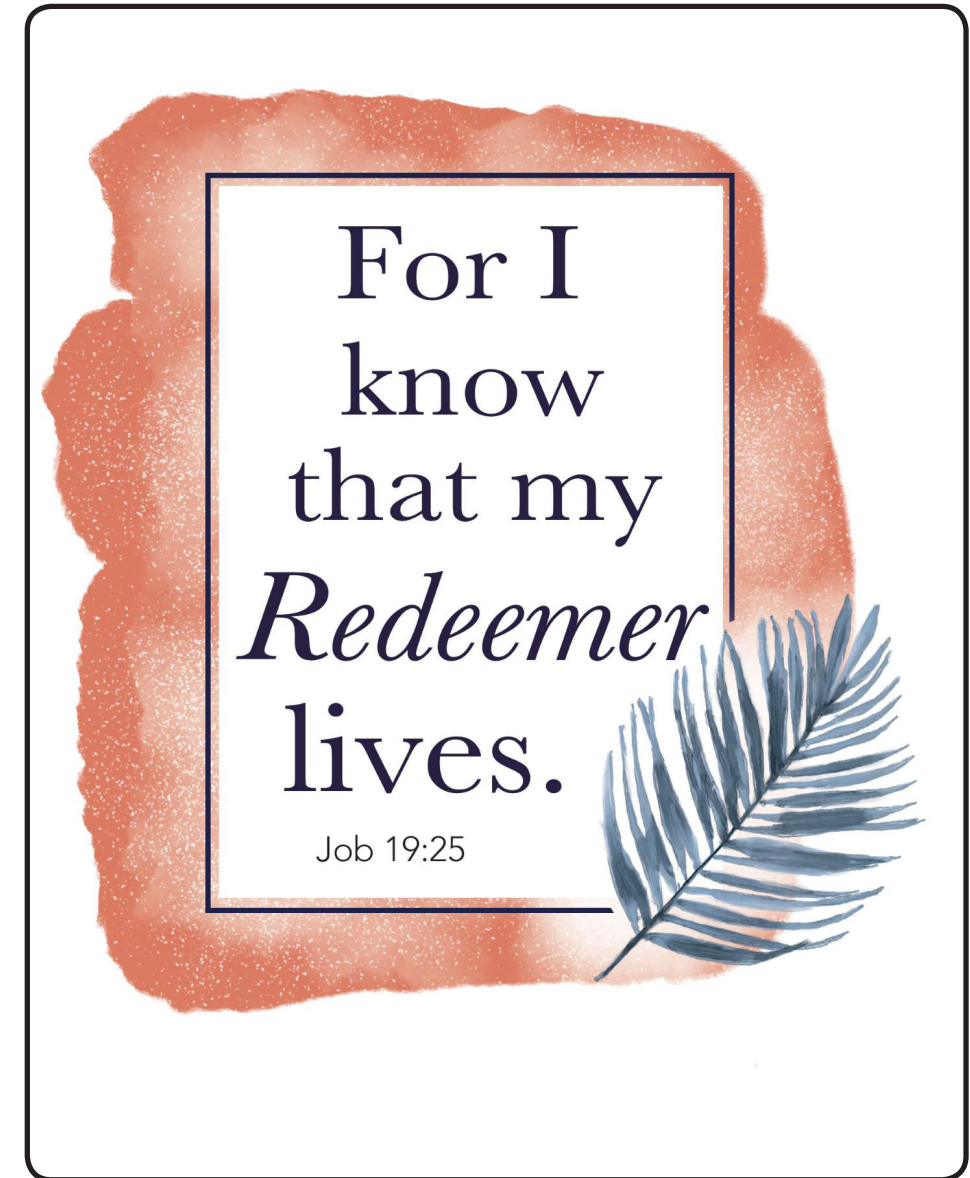
