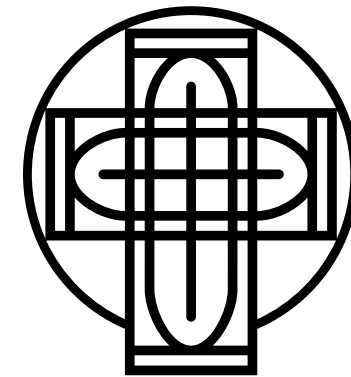

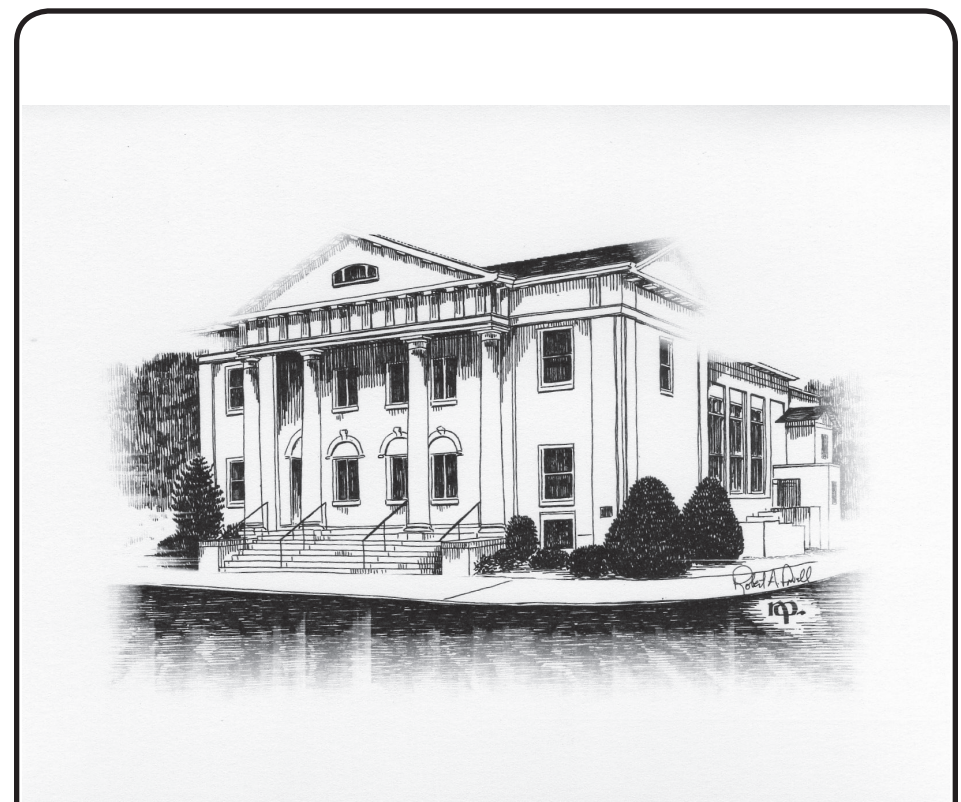

Carnegie Ministries was incorporated on July 3, 2003 as a 501(C)3 and is a certified agency of God’s Pantry Food Bank (GPFB) in Lexington.

Our sources of food are:

- USDA TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program)
- GFPB COOP Program (sold at their discounted cost)
- Kroger Donations
- Local purchases and donations.

Last year we served 1,319 households comprising 2,269 people and distributed over 53,000 pounds of food valued at about \$90,000.

Our program is sustained by generous support from our church, by donations from friends of the pantry, and by tribute gifts in honor or in memory of a loved one or in celebration of a special event in someone’s life.
