**Stained Glass Saints** 

Today we remember Sandy Stansberry and Fred Warwick

Sandy Wyrick Stansberry was a life-long resident of Corbin who came to First Baptist Church from Central Baptist when she married another Corbinite, John Stansberry. Known as hosts par excellence, Sandy and John often entertained visiting ministers and musicians in their welcoming North Corbin home. Sandy, one of the early female deacons at First Baptist, was a dedicated teacher in the Children II Sunday School department and often delivered the Children's Sermon in Sunday morning worship services. Sandy died in May, 1994 at the age of 44 from diabetes-related illnesses, leaving behind her husband John, and her beloved children, Chris and Danielle.

Fred and Carolyn Warwick moved to Corbin from the Knoxville area and soon became enmeshed in the life of First Baptist Church. Fred worked in our food pantry, was a deacon, a van driver, a Sunday School teacher, a rummage sale worker, and operated the audio/visual system that allowed us to broadcast our services on local access cable. After retirement from the Baptist hospital- where Fred was in charge of the hospital computer system - he could often be found at the church, working on a myriad of projects.

One might wonder why these two saints are paired together. It's easy - Sandy and Fred had a love for childrenthose in our church and in our community - that is probably unsurpassed by any two people in our church's history. It was not uncommon for Fred and Sandy to adopt whole families in our community, offering them not just food and clothing, but a love and concern that impacted their spiriual lives, their academic success and their general well-being.

Both of these saints died too soon, but they offered a lifetime of love to this church and community. We give thanks for Fred Warwick and Sandy Stansberry, our Stained **Glass Saints.**

Last Thursday night was a significant night in the life of our church. We gathered, 50 of us or so, and discussed the White Flag Ministry. Whether or not you attended, you are probably aware of some of the concerns people have about the future of our ministry. In five total seasons, the White Flag Ministry has grown beyond our wildest dreams. While we give thanks to God for the ability to reach more people, we also realize we are doing ministry beyond what we

At our town hall discussion, the White Flag leadership team acknowledged the concerns of our fellowship. We revealed several new measures we are employing this season to help with some of the concerns. Most notably, we have reimagined our entire checkin process, emphasizing extended dialogue with potential patrons in hopes to create a relationship with them and to determine their needs. The goal of these new measures is to help prevent misuse of

RRJ Solutions, who joined us near the end of last season, will be with us this year again. They offer case management and specialize in addiction recovery. A screening with them is required to utilize our services. RRJ Solutions proved quite helpful in a short time last season as they were able to help others get into sober living homes, obtain gainful employment, and take steps toward sustainability. While there is much left to do, I find myself grateful for a courageous conversation. Amid all the concerns, a calmness was felt throughout the room as we tried to listen to each other. Moving forward, we realized we need further conversation, so a future date and time will be announced. In the meantime, the church has been charged with speaking to potential community partners to see if there are ways to do this ministry better.

As I emphasized in a sermon two weeks ago, the White Flag Ministry knows it can do better, but not without you. This requires much prayer, a spirit of unity and good faith, and a new resolve to do this vital ministry and to do it together. C. Christopher Smith writes, "Praying and talking together in a way that acknowledges both our unity and our disagreement is a means by which we learn patience." Patiently, even in disagreement, may we move forward united as Christ's body.  $\sim$  Alex
