Today we remember JB and Katherine Sasser

My father, Jennings Bryan Campbell Sasser, was known to most as "J.B." He was born in 1896 in Knox County (Big Richland) Kentucky and married my mother, Katherine Gilbert, in 1920 when she was a 19 yr old schoolteacher in a one room schoolhouse. They had 5 children, Earl, Lois, Faye, Carrie and Glenn. I do not know the exact date that my parents joined FBC but I was born in 1940 and they were already members there.

Dad was asked to serve as a Deacon many times but always declined because he preferred being an active member of the Brotherhood. In those days, the Brotherhood also had conventions and conferences with other churches and worked together on large projects. He attended many out of state conferences for this.

Some of the things I remember him doing for our church and community include: gathering \$1000 "notes" from members (like an IOU) to take to the bank as funding for the Education building we still use; helping Dr. Edwards obtain funding for the old SE KY Baptist Hospital and later raising funds for our new Baptist (Regional) in Corbin. He served on the original Board of Directors for both of these hospitals. He helped many people get jobs.

Dad was a GM (especially Buick) car dealer and received movies each week to share with the community. GM also provided the projector to show the movies. Dad would show these movies in our garage and 40-50 people would attend. Many of these people could not afford to attend the Hippodrome to see movies. The projectionist for the home movies was my brother-in-law, Bobby Goins, who also was a projectionist for the Hippodrome.

Dad and Mom spent many years attending FBC but after my Mom started losing a lot of her hearing she stayed home and Dad attended alone. They always believed in supporting the church and Dad was always available for visitation or helping others.

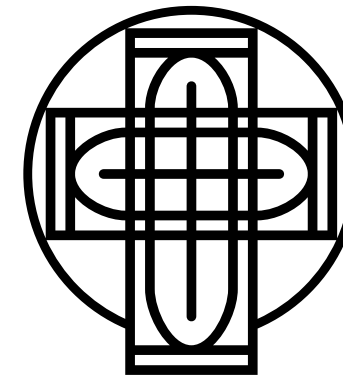
