QUARTERLY Business

At last week's Quarterly Business Meeting, those present and voting

* heard reports from standing committees,

* ratified the Church Budget for 2019-2020 (copies of the budget are available in church office),

* approved a recommendation from the Trustees to sell the Carnegie building to The Carnegie Center of Corbin, a community non-profit that intends to restore the building for use as a community meeting space.

* elected Gary Akins, Sarah Ashley, Mel Chandler, Katie House, and Gary Motz to serve three-year terms as deacon;

* elected a slate of officers for the 2019-2020 church year and elected committee members to a three-year rotation (a full listing of officers, committee members, and deacons is available in the church office);

* heard reports from the Pastor Search Committee and the Youth Pastor Search Committee; and,

* heard a report from the Church Council outlining preaching, teaching, and on-call responsibilities for the next three months (see accompanying article).

In the interim...

Article 9, Section 3 of First Baptist Church Bylaws reads, "When a ministerial staff vacancy occurs, the church council and remaining ministerial staff shall determine how to handle the coverage of the duties of the vacated position."

In the last ten weeks, we have heard seven different preachers seven distinct voices proclaiming God's word to us. And without exception, after each person has preached, someone has suggested, "Let's get that one as our interim." So, with the assumption that a variety of voices can more fully speak God's word to us (and the recognition that seven voices may be too many), the church council has endorsed a plan where Jefferson Calico, Phil Majors, and Alice Tremaine will share preaching responsibilities through the end of this calendar year. They will also share, with Paul Sims, teaching responsibilities for Wednesday evenings and Minister-on-call responsibilities.


