



There haven't been many times in my life when I thought to myself, "I feel like Jesus right now." Obviously, I wish I could say that more. Last Wednesday at the Rotary Park Block Party, I felt compassion and a concern in a way similar to the way I think Jesus felt in Matthew 9. Jesus had been in cities, villages, and synagogues, proclaiming good news and healing people. He looked around and saw a large crowd of people and he felt compassion for them because there weren't enough people to help them. With a concerned tone he spoke to his disciples, saying, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Today, I am asking you to be laborers in God's harvest. Last Wednesday, we had over 50(!) students at the Rotary Park Block Party. It was a remarkable turnout—remarkable to the point of being overwhelming. We ran out of hot dogs and bottled water. We had several adults helping, but it wasn't enough.

Our Wednesday night ministry is so important for these students' lives. These students, for the most part, are from less than ideal family situations. Their time spent with us is one of the few times, maybe the only time, per week that they experience the love of God in a healthy and focused atmosphere. These students need us. And, truthfully, we need them if we are to answer our call to be God's church to our community.

As it stands, we don't have enough drivers to pick up and take these students home. We also don't have enough teachers investing in these students' lives. If this continues, that will be 50 students who stay at home and miss the opportunity to experience the love of God in the way that only this church can show them. We have a wonderful opportunity in front of us: God is calling us to be the church to these students. Will we answer?
