

This Sunday, we are privileged to hear from former interim pastor, **Ron Higdon**. A graduate of Georgetown College, The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, he has pastored churches in Kentucky, North Carolina, and Virginia. For twenty years he was pastor of Broadway Baptist Church in Louisville. Since retirement, Dr. Higdon has served as intentional interim pastor at churches in Georgia, Kentucky, and Texas.

He is the co-author with Perry Bramlett of *Touring C. S. Lewis' Ireland & England,* and has three books published by Parson's Porch Press:

From Fear to Faith: The Spiritual Journey from Anxiety to Trust; But If Not: Mastering the Art of Letting Go; and In the Meantime: Learning to Live in Difficult Times.

In 2014, Energion Publications released Surviving a Son's Suicide: Finding Comfort and Hope in Faith, Friends, and Community. His most recent books include *All I Need To Know I'm Still Learning at Eighty and The Question That Won't Go Away: Why Doesn't God Do Something? In August, Energion Press released his newest book, *Aging is Not Optional: How We Handle It Is.

Dr. Higdon resides in Louisville with his wife, Patricia, who is a retired marriage and family counselor.

We welcome Dr. Higdon back to Corbin and to First Baptist.
