

Stained Glass Saints

Today we remember William Carlisle Ashley

Following his service in World War II, William Carlisle Ashley moved from South Carolina to Corbin in 1947 with his new bride, Sarah. Dr. E.O. Edwards, a native of the same area of South Carolina as W.C., was our pastor at the time. After learning of the Ashley's arrival and the South Carolina connection, he began an intense recruiting effort to bring W.C and Sarah into the FBC family. His efforts were successful, and W.C. and Sarah became members shortly after moving to town. This was followed by W.C. becoming a deacon a short while later. As had become a pattern in his life, W.C. found ways to serve others immediately. Througout the 1950's he continued his role as a deacon and helped lead the Sunday School training program for the youth of the church. In the early 1960's, our church needed additional space and W.C. spearheaded a fundraising campaign and construction plan to build the eduation wing and fellowship hall. In a church publication from 1962 titled "Our Unfinished Story", W.C. addressed the church as chairman of the deacons regarding the proposed project. He wrote "If we are to follow our Savior then we are to be concerned for all of the people we are not reaching, plus those already attending services. With our additional space, we will have more space to care for our members, plus reaching out for those that we are so concerned about - the lost that need a Savior. Let us all pray that God will help us in our efforts to be faithful witnesses in our community and that we will continue to be blessed by the new additions." In 1971, church records show that W.C. recommended the church purchase a black and white television camera and other essential equipment for the purpose of televising the Sunday morning worship service live over local t.v. This ministry was an innovative first for our area. In addition to being a deacon for over 60 years, W.C. was especially fond of the Thursday night visitation ministry, where in the 1980's he often found himself partnered up with a young Paul Sims. For 62 years, W.C. Ashley was a devoted member who deeply loved this church.


